How the Services Pupil Premium is used at St Peter's CoE Primary School

Schools receive the SPP so that they can offer mainly pastoral support during challenging times and to help mitigate the negative impact on service children of family mobility or parental deployment. At St Peter's CoE Primary School we employ Beverly Cawthera, our Social, Emotional and Mental Health Lead, who offers support to pupils and their families.

As a school we have decided that for the 2019/2020 academic year that we will support Services Pupil Premium pupils by covering the cost of class curricular trips and the cost of University of Exeter curricular enrichment opportunities (available to KS2 only). We want all Services Pupil Premium pupils to embrace the wider aspects of our curriculum. However, we do not cover the cost of clubs or peripatetic music tuition.
